Brother Priests:

FIRST: Today Governor DeWine announced that the stay-at-home order already in place will now be extended. With this in mind please read carefully the attached statement from the Catholic Conference of Ohio.

SECOND: The Congregation for Divine Worship has promulgated a new Mass Formulary: "In Time of Pandemic." Information on this is also attached is several PDF documents from the USCCB. With Palm Sunday, Holy Week, the Sacred Triduum, Easter and the Easter Octave quickly approaching, there are two days whereby you could celebrate this Mass In Time of Pandemic -- April 3 and 4. I would encourage you to celebrate this Mass on these two days.

Let us continue to pray for one another during these times, and let us pray a prayer composed by Saint Francis de Sales, the patron saint of our Columbus Diocese:

*Do not look forward in fear to the changes and chances of this life;
Rather, look to them with full confidence that, as they arise,

He has guided you thus far in life, and He will lead you safely through all trials;
and when you cannot stand it, God will bury you in His arms.*

He will either shield you from suffering,
or will give you unfailing strength to bear it.*

Catholic Bishops of Ohio Extend Suspension of All Publicly Celebrated Masses/Liturgies

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today (April 2, 2020) Governor Mike DeWine extended the executive “Stay at Home Order” to continue to curb the spread of the Coronavirus in the State of Ohio. Out of deep concern for the common good, as well as the physical and spiritual well-being of all the people of Ohio, the Catholic Bishops of Ohio have agreed once again to cooperate with the governor’s direction.

To that end, the Catholic Bishops of Ohio extend the temporary suspension of all publicly celebrated Masses/liturgies at least through and including Sunday May 3rd. The Bishops of Ohio dispense the Catholic faithful who reside in their respective dioceses and all other Catholics currently in Ohio from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass during this time period.

This decision has not been taken lightly and, as your bishops, together with you, we recognize the sacrifice we are called to make by being physically distanced from the Holy Eucharist and from one another.

Trusting in the graces flowing from the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of Our Lord, we remain mindful of the hope that does not disappoint. As your bishops, we continue to encourage you to keep holy the Lord’s Day by participating in Sunday Mass by way of televised, live-streamed, or radio broadcast options and making a spiritual communion. Keeping in mind the gift of plenary indulgences offered to us by the Church, we encourage all the faithful to turn to the Church’s treasury of prayer, praying as a family or individually the rosary, divine mercy chaplet, the Liturgy of the Hours and Stations of the Cross, etc.

Please join us in praying for all who are suffering from the Coronavirus, for all health care workers and first responders, and for an easing of the anxiety and tension caused by this pandemic. Relying on the Motherly care of Our Lady, Health of the Sick, we unite our sufferings to those of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and we trust in the glorious hope of His resurrection.

Re: CDW Resources: sample Good Friday intercession and Mass formulary
“In Time of Pandemic”

Your Eminence / Your Excellency:

The Congregation for Divine Worship has promulgated two new resources for liturgical prayer in this difficult time:

- (1) **An intercession that can be used with the Solemn Intercessions on Good Friday.** The decree says that the Congregation “proposes an intention” – therefore, it still falls to the Diocesan Bishop to “permit or order the addition of a special intention” for this ceremony (*Roman Missal*, Good Friday, n. 13). The bishop could choose to use the text proposed by the Congregation, or the one previously sent out by the Secretariat, or one of his own choosing. A copy of the decree and the new text in English, Spanish, and Latin is being distributed to the bishops along with this memorandum.
- (2) **A new Mass formulary, In Time of Pandemic.** The usual guidelines for the use of Masses for Various Needs and Occasions apply to this Mass. Note that the rubric at the beginning of the Mass indicates days when it may *not* be used; otherwise permission for its use is generous. A copy of the decree and the new texts in English, Spanish, and Latin is being distributed to the bishops along with this memorandum.

Since the material from the Holy See included only a list of the readings to be used with this new Mass formulary, the Secretariat for Divine Worship has prepared files with the readings in English and Spanish. Those readings are also being distributed with this memorandum.

Bishops are invited to share this material with their priests. Links to these files will also be posted soon to the USCCB website, together with many other resources for this time of crisis, at: usccb.org/coronavirus.

**DECREE
on the special intention to be added to the Solemn Intercessions
during the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord
for the year 2020 only**

The Celebration of the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday this year has a particular significance because of the terrible pandemic that has stricken the whole world.

Indeed, on the day on which we celebrate the redeeming passion and death of Jesus Christ on the Cross, who like a slain lamb has taken upon himself the suffering and sin of the world, the Church raises her voice in prayer to God the Father Almighty for all humanity, and in particular for those who suffer most, while she awaits in faith the joy of the resurrection of her Spouse.

Therefore this Congregation, in virtue of the faculties granted to it by the Supreme Pontiff FRANCIS, availing itself of a possibility already granted in the Roman Missal to the Diocesan Bishop in a situation of grave public need, proposes an intention to be added to the Solemn Intercessions of the above mentioned celebration, so that the prayers of those who invoke him in their tribulation might reach God the Father and so that, even in their adversity, all can experience the joy of his mercy.

The text of the invitation and the prayer is attached to this Decree.

All things to the contrary notwithstanding.

**DECREE
on the Mass in Time of Pandemic**

In these days, during which the whole world has been gravely stricken by the Covid-19 virus, many requests have come to this Dicastery to be able to celebrate a specific Mass to implore God to bring an end to this pandemic.

Therefore this Congregation, in virtue of the faculties granted to it by the Supreme Pontiff FRANCIS, gives permission to celebrate the Mass in Time of Pandemic, on any day except Solemnities, the Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter, days within the Octave of Easter, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), Ash Wednesday and the days of Holy Week (cf. *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, n. 374), for the duration of the pandemic.

The text of the Mass formulary is attached to this Decree.
