FOURTH: The rules regarding the Payroll Protection Program loans from the Small Business Administration are not yet complete but they are looking favorable. Tomorrow morning I will be sending instructions to the Financial Staff across the Diocese on preparation they can do. If you could assure that your financial person/people look for my e-mail tomorrow morning I would much appreciate it. These loans are critical as they provide funds for 8 weeks of payroll and benefits for our employees.
